An individual might find himself or herself in one of the following situations:

Unconscious of the projection of peaceability, predictability, and ethicality.[1]

Unaware of the projection of mental states.

Mental states are something to work with. They are an entire space of meaning and points. With the thinking mind, it's sometimes difficult to work with a sense of mental space, and to clarify mental states. But with the perceptual mind, the mental space mind, the nondual mind, it's fairly noticeable to be aware of mental states and the unfolding relational within one's own mind.

Peaceability, predictability, and ethicality are likewise something to work with. They influence the karmic 'action' that one undertakes, and this influences outcomes. Even if an apparent mistake is made, one can better assess that mistake, or keep one's spirit clear, and then more deeply probe karma (action that produces a result). But the mistake or not may, if well understood on some level, have an unanticipated outcome that is surprising and beneficial. So then it becomes something to work with and unfold over time. This is realistic.

The projection of peaceability, predictability, and ethicality may be important – it is sort of a 3-space that you-and-the-other find yourselves in, at-one with the world. You project and the other sees, and it is your projection to the world, and to others. Their perceptions are important, and to move adeptly, one should be aware of them. In another paper[2] I write, "We are relative to all people; not just those that are our relatives." So we should be aware of this. It matters what you do in this space.

Likewise, the projection of mental states is what you bring from innermost consciousness and conscious awareness to manifest at-one with the world, that you bring with/to the world-space, including things and others, and the place of neither being nor non-being that is all things. This is a pleasant, dynamic place to be!
